Skype delivers on the promise of modern global communications by giving its users extensive voice and video calling features, some of which are unavailable on traditional telephones, as well as instant messaging and file sending features.

You can also take advantage of other features that include SkypeOut (call from Skype to traditional landlines or mobiles), SkypeIn (a phone number your friends can call, you answer in Skype) and Skype Voicemail (takes your calls when you are busy or offline). These are not free, but pretty cheap.
